tainer. It is advantageous for a leather or other washer f^3 to encircle the tube end f for the purpose of effecting a liquid tight joint.

Having now particularly described and ascertained the nature of my said invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, I declare that what I claim is:—

10 1. A wick trimmer of the kind referred to, constructed to perform the additional function of constituting a closure cap to the filling opening of the oil vessel when not being used as a trimmer, substan15 tially as described.

2. A wick trimmer in accordance with Claim 1 characterised by the provision at the lower end of the wick trimmer of internal screw threads adapted for

engagement with a correspondingly 20 threaded projecting tube constituting the fixed filling opening to the vessel, substantially as described.

3. A wick trimmer in accordance with Claim 2 wherein the exterior surface of 25 the lower end of the cylindrical cap is formed substantially plain for the purpose of revolubly fitting within the central draught tube when the perforated cap has been removed, substantially as 30 described with reference to the annexed drawing.
